



Each 2.25ml multidose vial contains: 6 x 0.3ml dose



Refrigerated storage (2°C to 8°C) once thawed: 10 weeks expiry date

COVID-19: Eligible Cohorts



Aged 75 years or older. This includes those due to turn 75 years of age on or before the end of the scheduled seasonal vaccination campaign



Immunosuppressed patients aged 18 to 74 years (as defined in table 3 in the COVID-19 chapter of the Green Book)



All residents of a care home for older adults registered with RQIA





Note: COVID-19 Vaccination Eligibly in Care Homes for Younger Adults

Care Homes for <u>younger adults</u>:

Immunosuppressed residents should be vaccinated.

- Although the vaccine isn't 100% effective, it lowers the chances of having severe complications from the flu. This is especially true for people who are at high risk of flu complications.
- Vaccine effectiveness results show that 2024/25 influenza vaccinations offered protection against hospitalisation:

~61% in children

~43% in adults aged 18 - 64

~42% in adults 65+





Training

- Vaccinators should ensure they complete the COVID-19 training requirements and the vaccinator competency assessment tool.
- Vaccinators should ensure they complete face to face training and refresher training for injection technique and basic life support.
- Annual updates should be undertaken to ensure knowledge and practice remain current. Periodic face to face refresher training for vaccinators should be considered.

Care Homes

- Ensure correct RQIA code is attributed to correct patient – especially dual registered homes!
- Provide a proforma to the care home lead to facilitate the identification of residents to be vaccinated
- Care home lead completes and returns resident dataset – ensure best interest decisions have been made

- Any access issues should be reported to the Pharmacy Vaccination Team:



Duplicate Vaccination – Failure to Check VMS Prior to Vaccination



Patient wrongly recorded as vaccinated – Vaccination withheld by other provider



Delayed Recording on VMS caused confusion with GP Practice

VMS Clinic Mode




- Available for generation of care home lists and faster bulk data entry
- Searches for patients by RQIA code and creates vaccination list
- Training: <u>PHA Video</u> and <u>SPPG Quick Reference</u>
 <u>Guide</u>
- CAUTION: Be careful when selecting patients: records are generated in one click, double check before selecting the patient



Social Care VMS Clinic Mode: Points to Note



1. You will need to generate separate clinic lists for each scenario



2. In order to generate a clinic list you need to add a number of vaccination particulars including 'Site of vaccine', all of these details can be changed before you record the vaccination.

TOP TIP: Choose default vaccination sites for each vaccine type i.e.. COVID: Left Arm, Flu: Right Arm and stick to this where possible. Vaccinations with the same particulars can be added in bulk.

Left arm

Right arm

Left thigh

Right thigh

Left buttock

Right buttock

Select site of vaccine

3. CAUTION: Be careful when selecting patients: records are generated in one click, double check before selecting the patient.




Social Care VMS Clinic Mode: Points to Note



Creating a patient list in 'Clinic' function:

Step 1: Scroll to the bottom of the patient search page and select 'Add Patients to a Clinic'



Step 2: Add the vaccine details to be used for the clinic inc. injection site


Clinic - Vaccination Entry

Enter the details for the vaccinations that will be administered at this clinic, these details will be recorded against each patient record when the 'Record' button is clicked








Social Care VMS Clinic Mode: Record Vaccinations
