SERIOUS SHORTAGE PROTOCOL WITHDRAWAL – ADIPINE® XL (NIFEDIPINE) 30MG MODIFIED-RELEASE TABLET AND ADIPINE® XL 60MG MODIFIED-RELEASE TABLET


Serious shortage protocols (SSPs) under the Human Medicines Regulations 2012 (HMRs) are an additional tool to manage and mitigate medicines shortages. An SSP enables community pharmacists to supply a specified medicine in accordance with a protocol rather than a prescription, without needing to seek authorisation from the prescriber, saving time for patients, pharmacists and prescribers. They are used in the case of a serious shortage, where a medicine would be likely to be out of stock for some time, and if, in the opinion of ministers, it would help manage the supply situation.

I am writing to inform you that the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) has confirmed that the supply situation regarding the availability of **Adipine® XL (nifedipine) 30mg modified-release tablets and Adipine® XL 60mg modified-release tablets** has changed, with the products now being discontinued. Consequently, **SSP084** and **SSP085** which were due to expire on Friday 6 February 2026 are being withdrawn and will now expire on **Friday 23 January 2026**.

Action Required

All relevant staff should be made aware of these SSP withdrawals. I would ask the SPPG to bring this information to the attention of GP Practices and Community Pharmacists directly.
